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HOSPITAL PROFILE

BACKGROUND

St. Martin de Porres Hospital was established in October, 1946 as a Clinic and Maternity Home by Bishop Joseph Oliver Bowers SVD (Emeritus).

AIMS:

Bishop Bower's aim of establishing the Clinic was to provide Health Care and Maternity services for inhabitants of the Manya Krobo District.

This was due to the difficulties the people were facing during that time in accessing health care.

FIRST MANAGERS:

The first sisters to work in this clinic were Rev. Sisters Helen, Louis and Jacinta. These sisters paid a visit to the Konor Nene Azu Mate Korley of the Manya Krobo in his residence to thank him for donating such a large parcel of land for the clinic work.

The sisters were then housed in the classroom of the then teacher training college now the nurses quarters just after the laboratory until their permanent convent was built in 1948 (i.e St. Martin's Convent).

As they operated the clinic and the maternity, the people began associating with them and started assessing clinic and maternity services. Many babies were delivered that time. Some are now professionals including religious and priests.

Thanks to Bishop Oliver Bowers and his vision and the willingness of the sisters who shared their knowledge and talents with us.

DEVELOPMENTS:

In 1960 the first doctor's bungalow was built. In 1961, the clinic initiated the Primary Health Care services to neighbouring villages on Tuesdays and Fridays.

In 1981, the missionary sisters of the Holy Spirit (SSPS) handed over the administration of the clinic and maternity to the indigenous or local congregation, Handmaids of the Divine Redeemer of Accra.

Rev. Sr. Immaculata Frizer of blessed memory became the first nurse Administrator of the Clinic and Maternity until 1988.

In 1988, Dr. Rev. Sr. Margaret Mensah began the HIV/AIDS Home Based Program. She was working in the clinic as the medical officer in charge of the clinic and maternity.

In 1988, Rev. Sr. Immaculata handed over to Sr. Lydia Amponsah. In 1998, Sr. Immaculata took over again from Sr. Cecilia.

In April 1997 the clinic was upgraded to the status of a hospital.
